Staff are encouraged to raise any concerns they have and there is a process in place to ensure any such concerns are investigated.

With regard to seafarers working on board our vessels, we ensure that working conditions are compliant with the Maritime Labour Convention.

This statement is made pursuant to section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes our Group's slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 31 December 2022.
